Body mechanics: solid base of support, bend knees and use legs, don't jerk or twist, and back bowed in. Work on flexibility to prevent injury. Be sure to work on physical fitness.	VHS

An examination of the need for your organization to have an emergency preparedness plan and the roles needed to be addressed. Y.I.P.P.I.-- you. Identify. Plan. Prepare. Implement. Company should have an effective respirator protection program; respirators should be selected on the basis of hazards the worker will be exposed to; the user shall be instructed and trained on the in the proper use and the limitations; must be regularly cleaned and disinfected; be kept in clean and sanitary convenient locations; must be routinely inspected; monitor the work area conditions and the degree of worker exposure/stress; regular inspection and evaluation to follow continued effectiveness of respirator; persons should not be assigned unless they are physically able to perform the work and use the equipment; the respirator must be approved for the particular hazard. Make sure you know how to properly fit equipment and what to do in emergency situations; make sure you understand the capabilities and limitations of your equipment; maintain your equipment, keep it clean, sanitary and in servicable condition.
