DISCUSSION:

Background/History:

As mandated by State Statute (ARS 9-461.07) a jurisdiction's General (Comprehensive) Plan must be updated every 10 years, adopted by City Council and County Board of Supervisors, and ratified by voter ballot. The current Flagstaff Regional Land Use and Transportation Plan must be approved by 2012. The public process involves many public forums, interaction with Boards, Commissions and Agencies as well as with City Council and the County Board of Supervisors.) Appointed by the City Council and the County Board of Supervisors, the Citizen Advisory Committee (hereinafter referred to as CAC) consists of community volunteers with various fields of expertise willing to work along with the City and County Planners for 30 months at regularly scheduled monthly meetings and at various public forums. The City and County Staff Planners will manage the process while the CAC will help manage the content.

Ordinance 2008-34, "An Ordiance amending Title 2, Boards of and Commission, by addition Chapter 2-23, Creating a Flagstaff Area Regional Plan Citizens' Advisiory Committee and Declaring an Emergency," was approved on December 16, 2008. As a result, a Citizen Advisory Committee Selection Team was formed by the City of Flagstaff's City Council and Cocconino County's Board of Supervisors to review applications and make recommendations to fill the vacant Citizen Advisory Committee Member and Alternate Member seats.

On January 9, 2009 and January 27, 2009, the Citizen Advisory Committee Selection Team held a public meetings to review the Citizen Advisory Committee applications and to make recommendations of qualified individuals to serve on the Citizen Advisorary Committee based upon the criteria established by Ordinance 2008-34 and the categories established by Council's and the County Board of Supervisor's public discourse.

Key Considerations:

Per Ordinance 2008-34, the composition of the CAC is limited to a maximum of nineteen (19) members and three (3) alternatives, as follows:

Section 2-23-001-0002 Members and Officers:

The Flagstaff Area Regional Plan Citizens' Advisory Committee shall have no more than (19) members. All members shall reside within the Flagstaff Metropolitan Planning Organization boundary, and a majority shall be City of Flagstaff residents. The Flagstaff City Council shall appoint at least ten (10) but no more than twelve (12) members; the Coconino County Board of

Supervisors shall appoint at least seven (7) but no more than nine (9) members; three (3) alternates shall be appointed by the City Council, which the Council shall designate as a first, second and third alternate.

Through public hearings conducted the by Coconino County Board of Supervisors and the City of Flagstaff City Council, it was desired and recommended by the respective Board and Council that the CAC have representation from the following categories:

- 1. Community members;
- 2. Academic;
- Developer/Builder;
- 4. Property Owner;
- 5. Renter;
- 6. Environmentalist (water);
- 7. Education K-12, Youth & Families;
- 8. Business/Chamber/Realtor;
- 9. Tourism/Sustainable Economic Development;
- 10. Cultural/Native American Tribal Representative;
- 11. Natural Resource Manager (water);
- 12. Design/Planning/Building Consultant;
- 13. Religious/Interfaith;
- 14. Seniors; and,
- 15. Medical.

Selection Methodology:

The City Council and Board of Supervisors instructed the selection methodology should be at the CAC Selection Team's discretion. Direction was given to staff to organize the applications and provide a list displaying which categories the applicants' self-indicated. The County Board of Supervisors and City Council acknowledged some applicants may belong to more than one category. Through the application review process, the CAC Selection Team was able to fill each category listed above as they deemed the most qualified applicant.

Community Benefits and Considerations:

A co-operative effort between the City Council and County Board of Supervisors occurred to create a Community Advisory Committee that represents a cross-section of the region. The "List of Recommended Citizen Advisory Committee and Alternate Members" (attached as Exhibit I and III) contains at least one community member that belongs to one of the fifteen (15) categories listed above in Key Considerations (e.g. Community member, academic, developer/builder, etc.).

Community Involvement:

The Regional Plan update application process was advertised in the newspaper and published upon the City's website. Staff received **54** applications with 37 applicants residing in city corporate limits and **17** applicants residing within the County.
