II. NEW BUSINESS

1. Non-Standard Artistic Crosswalk Policy

The City Council has requested a future agenda item regarding installation of an artistic crosswalk. The MUTCD is fairly clear in its Official Ruling on this topic. The USDOT is advising against art in crosswalks other than subdued patterns like brick pavers and the like. Several communities have found a way to do some form of artistic crosswalk by creating policies that limit the application locations and format of the artistic crosswalk applications in an

effort to minimize degradation of the visibility and effectiveness of crosswalk marking traffic control devices.

Staff have met with and reviewed several cities guidance on this topic in order to formulate a draft policy for discussion.

Requested action: Review materials, offer recommendations on final draft for City Council consideration in February 2023.

2. Naming the Sheeps Crossing FUTS tunnel for Cosmic Ray Brutti

This is a citizen-initiated request to name the tunnel under I-17 that contains the Sheep Crossin FUTS in honor of Cosmic Ray (Raymond J. Brutti)

Staff will review the naming process, provide information on a citizen survey and then outline the steps towards City Council adoption. More information is included [here](#) in the Bicycle Advisory Committee staff report from November 3, 2022.

Requested action: Provide feedback and make a positive recommendation to the City Council.

3. Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee appointments

The Transportation Commission is authorized to make appointments to its two committees, the Bicycle Advisory Committee and the Pedestrian Advisory Committee. The Staff Report contains information and recommendations regarding each appointment and re-appointment
