The Phoenix Avenue Bridge Project is Complete!

Aging infrastructure replaced in Downtown

Phoenix Avenue reopened between Mike’s Pike and Beaver Street, after a closure that began last summer. This project replaced the existing stormwater box culvert bridge structure, built in 1921, bringing it up to Arizona Department of Transportation standards. The box culvert extending under the sidewalk and adjacent building on Phoenix Avenue was replaced and reinforced to meet current standards. The original 114-year-old 6” cast iron pipe was replaced and upsized to a 12” ductile iron waterline. The roadway was lowered, re-profiled and paved, improving surface drainage along Phoenix Avenue. New frontage improvements consisting of curb, gutter and sidewalk were also constructed on both sides of Phoenix Avenue.

The first traffic crossed the new Phoenix Avenue bridge on February 21st, 2022. Transportation safety intersects with stormwater conveyance and waterline distribution systems in this project, keeping downtown safe and flowing!
