NAU Music Program Performs ‘The Secret History of Water’

On February 13th, The Kitt School of Music presented “The Secret History of Water”, an installment in the program’s 2021-2022 Faculty Artist Series. This event showcased five artists performing a wide selection of songs from the early 19th century to modern day, all with one common theme: water.

With haunting melodies that reflect the ebb and flow of water in a mountain creek or vast ocean, the influence of this precious natural resource in the music was tangible. The event was preceded by a short monologue from one of the performers, highlighting the importance of water conservation and what the audience could do to minimize their impact.

Flagstaff’s Water Conservation Program took an active role at this event, tabling out front of the recital hall and offering free water-saving devices to attendees. Staff talked about consultation and rebate programs and handed out high-efficiency shower heads, aerators, home efficiency kits, and more to many of the nearly 75 community members in attendance.
